#### THE OLD BRITANNIA SCHOOLHOUSE

The Old Britannia Schoolhouse was formerly the School Section #12,, Toronto Township School. It was built as a Common School in 1852 and replaced an earlier wooden schoolhouse which had fallen into disrepair.

The school's history is unusual. It is situated on a 200 acre land now known as Britannia School Farm. In 1819 this lot was appropriated for the use of a schoolmaster. In 1833 it was granted by the Crown in trust for the maintenance of a school and the advancement of education in Toronto Township.

In 1959, after having been attended by several generations of local children and witness to many change, The Britannia School closed. For several years the schoolhouse stood empty and deteriorated badly.

In 1982 the Peel Board of Education restored the schoolhouse to be a "living history" site and established and funded a programme there for students from across Peel to visit to participate in a school day as it would have been experienced by rural pupils "long ago". Since its restoration nearly 100,000 students have had their classroom studies enriched by a day of role playing at The Old Britannia Schoolhouse.

Due to budget restraints, the schoolhouse programme was "cut back" in 1992 and closed completely for the 1993-94 school year. However, in September 1994 the programme was reimplemented on a more cost recovery basis. Funds for the programme are now raised in part through user fees, community partnerships and volunteer initiatives.

From September 1994 until June 30, 2004, the programme was operated by the Centre for Education and Training Branch of the Peel District School Board. Since that time it has been operated and supported by the Alternative Programmes Department of the Peel District School Board.

During the 2012 calendar year 2847 Peel students visited The Old Britannia Schoolhouse for a day of role playing.

Friends of the Schoolhouse is an independent and self-sustaining association of concerned citizens dedicated to preserving and supporting The Old Britannia Schoolhouse and its educational programmes by acting as an advocacy and an advisory body body on behalf of the students of Peel.

\*acting through their Executive as an advisory committee to the Peel District School Board. \*providing support for schoolhouse staff and decision makers.

## Heritage Gardens

# **Karen Simmons**

In April, a new committee was formed to take over the management and care of the gardens.

Volunteers helped to do a spring clean up on 4 Saturdays.

Evergreens that had been planted as seedlings several years ago at the edges of the vegetable and perennial gardens were donated to volunteers who came to dig them up.Roses were pruned, and some new ones planted. Some raspberry canes were cut back and dug out by volunteer Frank. This provided space for an annual garden of Love Lies Bleeding, Nasturtium, Nicotiana, Cleome, etc.

The Teachers' Arbour was restored and painted by Ken Robinson. Eva Ardiel planted and maintained the gardens by the Schoolhouse door.

A new cedar arbour with bench was erected to honour Joan Reid, and a dedication plaque mounted on a slab of granite beside it.

The Field Centres purchased a good wheelbarrow to help with our work.

The rose garden was professionally weeded. A truck load of mulch was purchased and spread on the rose and vegetable gardens. The trees were fertilized, and the front hedge trimmed. A third arbour was installed over the walkway to the parking lot.

Marg Carson and her sister Cathy have worked on restoring the native perennial garden, and created a small garden around the bird bath. Volunteer Laurie Da Silva kept the planters watered all summer.

Schoolmistress Chris and her husband Jim added a load of topsoil to the vegetable garden, and created a system of hoses and connectors to help water the gardens.

The lavender was harvested to use for making sachets for sale.

Student and adult volunteers did a fall clean up.

Two classes from Judith Nyman School, while doing a course with Field Centre staff on using garden tools, finished the clean up, and pruned raspberry canes back to the rail fence. Shirley Hoad and Jean Robinson cut back all the rose bushes. Schoolmaster Marc planted daffodil bulbs.

Garden vegetables were entered in the Brampton Fair, where they won several ribbons.

A new 8' x 12' garden shed was erected to be used for storing tools and equipment, and for starting seedlings in the spring for the vegetable garden. Marc gave the shed its first coat of paint.

Many thanks to all the Friends and volunteers who helped us all season.



#### Hosting - Joan Moon

After considerable discussion, it became apparent in 2012 that we could no longer continue to host retirements and other celebrations.

We subsequently began hosting couples and wedding parties who chose The Old Britannia Schoolhouse as the site of pictures for their special day. O.B.S> has become a very popular site for such pictures, and is both enjoyable and profitable for The Friends of the Schoolhouse.

#### Publicity - Jean Robinson

Disseminating information to the public about the events held at The Schoolhouse and at outside venues by the Friends of The Schoolhouse is done in four ways: printed flyers and brochure inserts produced in September; postings on the Britannia Schoolhouse Friends website; inclusion on the Peel District School Board electronic communication system, and announcements of events placed in the local print media (Mississauga News and The Booster).

As in previous years, the first three methods of communication seems to be the most successful. Announcements placed in the print media publications are not in a prominent place and therefore easily overlooked by readers. All four ways will continue to be used in the coming year.



The Friends of the Schoolhouse have been saddened by the death of Joan Reid in August, 2012. She had been a vital member of our organization for many years, serving as convenor for the Hallowe'en events, as Chair of the Research and Archives Committee, and as Executive Director. Her vision for and development of the Victorian Gardens have created a visual highlight of the Schoolhouse grounds.

Joan had spent many years gathering information about the many one roomed schoolhouses in Peel, and this research has been retained by The Friends of the Schoolhouse. The

amount of information is extensive, and a group is in the process of determining how best to make this material available to interested people. As plans become more clear, The Friends will keep you informed of progress. Any costs involved in this endeavour will be covered by a special fund.

Committee members attended the January and August Retailers' Gift Shows and the January Toy and Hobby Fair at the International and Congress Centres.

A few items of stock were replenished and a few new items were added to the inventory.

Committee members and friends of the committee members made a number of interesting items to sell, including lavender wands, sachets and dolls (with schoolhouse garden lavender), bees wax candles, woolly sheep, ribbon angels, clothes peg doll kits, felt ornament kits, etc...
